Daily Covid-19 Screening Questionnaire

Our families will play a crucial role in ensuring everyone's safe return to school. Some key elements of our school re-entry plan include:

- Completing the <u>COVID-19 Screening Questionnaire</u> every morning.
- Keeping children home if they show any signs or symptoms of illness.
- Sending only necessary items to school, such as snacks and lunches, labelled water bottles, a minimum of two face coverings stored in a paper or cloth bag and tissues. Students are not to bring any unnecessary items (i.e. toys).
- Ensuring your child's Emergency Contact Information is up-to-date with someone who can be at the school within an hour if required.
- Practicing social distancing, donning a mask, proper hand washing and respiratory etiquette with your child at home.



Traffic Safety

To ensure that all children arrive at school safely we have a 30 second student drop off/pick up zone conveniently located at the front doors of the school. Vehicles are to move steadily through this area to keep traffic flow optimized. For this reason, parking is NOT permitted in the drop off zone.

Should you wish to park and walk your child to their designated door, parking is located across the street beside Cottonwood Park with additional parking available on Conifer Street and Evergreen Street.

Pay School Fees Online!

Information regarding school fees will be posted on the *PowerSchool Parent Portal*, which can be found on our school website, by the end of September. All fees are due within 30 days of being posted. To access your fee information please log in to the *PowerSchool Parent Portal* and go to "Student Fees". You can view your fees and pay them online using Visa, MasterCard, or INTERAC Online. It is highly recommended that you log in to the *PowerSchool Parent Portal* regularly throughout the year as fees are added to cover costs for various activities such as field trips, class projects, team fees, etc. Please contact Lisa Waselenkoff in the school office at 780-467-2246 if you have any questions.

NOTE: If circumstances exist whereby you are unable to pay your student fees you can apply to EIPS to have the <u>fees waived</u> by submitting an <u>Application for a Waiver of Fees</u> by December 15, 2020. **NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

EIPS School Bus Quick Facts:

Did you know each EIPS bus is equipped with video surveillance? Video surveillance and equipment helps to:

- ensure the safety of all students, drivers and property; and
- discourage destructive acts.

On a regular basis, EIPS Student Transportation reviews the video recordings, in accordance with the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FOIP). The recordings assist the department with monitoring student and driver conduct and may be used as evidence in a disciplinary matter.

Enhancing Literacy and Numeracy

As part of Elk Island Public Schools' (EIPS) ongoing efforts to enhance the literacy and numeracy of students in all grade levels, the Division is once again administering the STAR and Math Intervention Programming Instrument (MIPI) assessment tools for all in-school learners in the 2020-21 school year. The tools focus on literacy and numeracy, are digitally based and offer an opportunity for students to demonstrate their learning. The goal is to provide timely information to teachers, help enhance classroom instruction and ensure student learning needs are identified.

At three points throughout the year, EIPS in-school students in grades 1 through 12 will complete the STAR assessment, which evaluates reading comprehension. The assessment takes approximately 20 minutes and is administered on a digital device. At least once throughout the year, in-school students in grades 2 through 10 will complete the MIPI assessment, which is a mathematic screening tool used to inform teachers about a student's math skills. For students in grades 7 through 10, the MIPI takes approximately 50 minutes, and for students in grades 2 through 6 it takes approximately 20 minutes. The results offer the teacher a clearer picture of a student's learning needs and help determine if subsequent instructional planning is required.

The scores of the assessments aren't used toward a student's grade, and there is no need to study ahead of time. The tools simply provide the teacher with information to better understand where each student is in terms of reading comprehension and mathematic ability. If, after analyzing the results, it's determined a student can benefit from extra support, the teacher will contact the family to discuss possible support strategies.

Update Your PowerSchool Information

The "Correction and Verification Form" is now available online through your <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u>. Families can use the form to access and update their child's information-including address, parent and guardian information, emergency contacts and any medical information. Reviewing and updating the form ensures the school has the most up-to-date information regarding your child. In particular, please pay close attention to all phone numbers, email addresses and emergency contact information. We will undoubtedly continue to have important information to communicate with families throughout this school year—whether your child is registered in in-school or out-of-school learning—and we want to ensure you receive this information. If you haven't already done so, we ask all Pine Street families to review their child's PowerSchool information by **September 20, 2020**.
