## **RESERVE SPENDING**

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The Board of Trustees approved the recommendation to ask the Minister of Education for permission to access Division reserves. To minimize school distributions, if approved, the work will take place during school break periods, starting summer 2023.

- Can we get another playground so older grades get more time? Funding for a new playground takes usually 4-5 years of fundraising. This would only start after approval from Strathcona County.
- Will we have a Track and Field Day this year? Yes, we are planning for the spring.
- Can parents volunteer at the school? Yes, we would love to have families come volunteer when they are available. Please email your kids teachers and make a plan of when to come. EIPS requires all volunteers to sign a Volunteer Confidentiality Form each year.
